Mac Memories

In the Spring of 1962, the McCaffery left its homeport of Mayport FL for a 6 month deployment to the Med as part of ComSixthFlt. We sailed across the Atlantic and went past Gibraltar. That was quite an experience for a city kid from Long Island like me, seeing that huge "Rock". During the deployment, we were in Naples for two weeks upkeep, and a group of us went on a USO tour to Rome, touring the ancient city. We also took a day trip to Pompeii, and I am still amazed by what we saw, just like stepping back 2000 years in history. Did you know that Pompeii had running water and indoor plumbing 2000 years ago? In the middle of our deployment we transited the Suez Canal to be part of ComMidEastFor. What a strange sight to see from the bridge as we were proceeding south through the canal: a man riding a camel on the canal berm just a short distance away to port. We stopped at Aqaba (as in "Lawrence of Arabia"), and hosted by the Jordan Arab Legion, toured the ancient

Nabatean city of Petra by horseback, donkey and camel. When we returned to the Med, we had a port call at Piraeus, the port city for Athens and toured that city, especially enjoying the Acropolis. We also visited France, anchoring just off the coast on the French Riviera by the cities of Cannes and Golf Juan. That was a very interesting visit! I remember being below deck when I felt the ship list to starboard. I didn't think much of it, guessing that the engineers were shifting fuel. Then the ship righted itself, and listed to port. Then it righted itself and listed to starboard again. So I went up on deck to see what was happening, and saw the reason. We were anchored close to shore about a half mile off the French Riviera, and some very attractive (and under-dressed) young ladies had rented paddle boats and were slowly circling the MAC, much to the delight of the crew, who were rushing from starboard to port and back again as the girls circled the ship. Mystery solved! Ah yes that was a fun cruise.
