**Meeting of the USS McCaffery Shipmates Association  
October 28, 2018  
Crowne Plaza Hotel, North Charleston, South Carolina**

The meeting was called to order by Association President Doug Hackett at 9:05 a.m. EDT

**President's Report:**

President Hackett reported 48 members were in attendance with an almost equal number of spouses and guests.

- Special guests were introduced including: Jean Crowell, widow of Ed Crowell, one of the driving forces in the formation of the association. Eugene and Jean Sweat; Eugene being the oldest shipmate in attendance, having served onboard McCaffery in 1046-1947.
- Recognized for their support in making this a successful reunion: Diana LaMontange, Patti Cromie, and Susan Little.
- Tom Ellis who traveled the greatest distance to the reunion – from Hawaii.
- First member to sign up – Charles Liles.
- And for his service as Vice President and newsletter editor, Rich Kuroski.

**Special recognition:**

President Hackett presented reunion organizer Ron Trippett with a McCaffery plaque recognizing his hard work in making the reunion a success, and also recognizing the work done by George Cromie in helping him, as well as Diana LaMontange, Patti Cromie, and Susan Little for their support.

**Election of Officers:**

It was moved and seconded that the current officers be re-elected to serve another two-year term. The motion passed without opposition.

The officers are:

- President – Doug Hackett
- Vice President – Rich Kuroski
- Treasurer – Ron Trippett
- Historian – Don Turk
- Membership – Lee Hendrickson and Ralph Despathy

**Next Association Reunion:**

In light of the dwindling number of crewmembers attending the reunions, President Hackett outlined options for the next association reunion, including:

1. That someone volunteer to take the lead/responsibility for the next reunion;
2. The McCaffery Association meet in conjunction with the Tin Can Sailor Association.

Pres. Hackett noted that other ship associations join in with the TCS Association this way. The individual ship association members would be charged an administrative fee similar to what we charge, which provides for registration and three meal functions. Ship association members may participate in as many of the TCS events as they wish on the same/similar basis as they would with the McCaffery Association's tours/events.

Discussion/ Q & A followed:

- Would we have our own meeting room? Answer - Yes
- Would all McCaffery members have to pay a fee to TCS? Answer - No
- Would we meet every year (as TCS does), or every two years? Answer – We could do as we please, but our experience is that our members prefer every other year.
- Would the McCaffery newsletter continue? Answer - Yes
- Will TCS promote the McCaffery reunion? Answer – Yes. President Hackett noted that 12 destroyer associations were listed in the Winter TCS newsletter as meeting in conjunction with the next TCS reunion.
- Average age of the TCS members? Answer - Unknown
- What month(s) does TCS hold its reunions? Answer – September/October
- Would there be a fee for the McCaffery Association to join with the TCS meeting? Answer - No
- Would registration be via current McCaffery Association or via TCS? Answer – Same as now, via McCaffery Association.

Following the discussion, President Hackett moved that we continue the USS McCaffery Association and meet in conjunction with the Tin Can Sailor Association. The motion was seconded, and passed. Note: the TCS reunion in two years (2020) will be in San Antonio, Texas.

**Newsletter:**

Due to health issues, Rich Kuroski is stepping down as newsletter editor following the next issue of the newsletter. James Bell (jb4813446@gmail.com) has agreed to take over the newsletter. Nick Donatiello will assist with the mailing aspects.

**McCaffery History:**

Historian Don Turk reminded members that we are posting crewmember photos to the Association website ([www.USSDD860.com](http://www.USSDD860.com)), and welcomes crewmember's active duty photos. Also, if a member has a cruise book they have no use for, we will donate it to the U.S. Navy Library collection.

**Reading of names of shipmates who have crossed the bar:**

The names of McCaffery crewmembers who are known to have passed since the Association's last reunion was read. It was noted that since the 2016 reunion, 139 shipmates have passed away. The names of the 139 shipmates were read, followed by eight bells, signifying that their watch has ended.

**The meeting was adjourned at 10:05 a.m. EDT**
