# USS McCaffery DD/DDE860 Reunion Plan

We will be staying at the Chattanooga Choo Choo hotel for our reunion. Built in 1908, Chattanooga's Terminal Station served for decades as the city's grand first impression, welcoming visitors with a soaring central dome adorned with brass chandeliers. Over the years, the station welcomed the likes of Woodrow Wilson and Franklin Roosevelt. After closing in the 1970s, the depot was eventually transformed into the Chattanooga Choo Choo Hotel. Now listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the hotel has a marble-clad lobby under the old dome and retail shops in the gardens along the former rail concourse. A 19th-century steam locomotive is on display in the rail yard.

**During Our Three Hour Cruise** on the Southern Belle, we will travel down to the river gorge, or more commonly known as the "Grand Canyon of the South"!
